## Br Andrew Smith OPA writes:-

## First Reading: Ezekiel 18: 25-28

The prophet Ezekiel continues his warnings about personal accountability, the consequences of sin, and God's mercy to the repentant sinner. He asks the question: "If the sinner must live with the consequences of his sins, what is the purpose of repentance?" The answer includes one of the most beautiful summaries of divine mercy in Scripture. God gives the assurance that He is always ready to forgive the sinner who humbly repents, turns away from selfishness, and restores fellowship with God. In His mercy, God even promises not to remember the transgressions which the sinner committed and repented.

Second Reading: Philippians 2: 1-11

Notices:-

Paul writes that Christians should think about unity based on the Christian community's threefold experience with the Holy Trinity: Christ's gift of salvation, God the Father's love, and the Holy Spirit's guidance. Paul's appeal to humility and obedience is rooted in what appears to be an ancient Christian hymn that

Paul wrote that we must conduct ourselves in a manner that is worthy of Christ. Paul testified that he would remain faithful to Christ no matter what the circumstances of his life. Paul bravely professed that he would honour God whether he lives and continues his apostolic work of spreading the Gospel of of salvation in a life that belongs to Christ through his Christian baptism, or if he is martyred and can bear his witness of Christ in his death.

#### Gospel : Matthew 21: 28-32

It is human pride that prevents repentance, as in the case of the chief priests and elders to whom Jesus addressed this parable. Their failure to humble themselves prevented them from acknowledging Jesus as Messiah. Jesus teaches that we must not allow pride to harden our hearts so that we fail to come to repentance, or close our eyes and ears to the message of Divine Love, like the proud and hard-hearted chief priests and elders. It is for all who know and admit that they need Jesus that he provides a sure path to follow on the pilgrimage to eternal life, first trod by His Mother Mary.

#### Collect

O God, who manifest your almighty power above all by pardoning and showing mercy, bestow, we pray, your grace abundantly upon us and make those hastening to attain your promises heirs to the treasures of heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
