Br Andrew Smith OPA writes:-

First Reading: *Proverbs 31: 10-13, 19-20, 30-31*

This is the epilogue to the Book of Proverbs. It forms an acrostic poem where each verse's first letter corresponds to a Hebrew letter in alphabetical order. This reading presents a series of wise sayings from a Mother to her Son concerning the qualities of an ideal wife. The entire poem may be symbolic since the prologue to the Book of Proverbs depicts "Wisdom" personified as a woman who invites everyone to a banquet at her house. The poem is a compliment to the moral strength of all godly women, and this God-given wisdom imbues His creation.

Second Reading: Thessalonians 5: 1-6

In St. Paul's letters, the "day of the Lord" refers to the "Second Coming" of Jesus. Paul compares the time leading up to the Last Judgment to a woman experiencing labour pains before childbirth. Night and darkness are symbols of sin and evil in Scripture. Paul says the coming of the Lord will take people by surprise like a thief in the night. We must be vigilant and walk in the light, as Jesus is the light; we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sins.

Gospel: Matthew 25: 14-30

Jesus tells a parable about the degrees of the fidelity of a Master's servants and their rewards according to their service. Jesus promises that those servants of His who strive to be faithful by using their gifts to serve the Church, each other, and the Kingdom will receive even more blessings to enrich their lives. However, the warning is that those who neglect their gifts will lose what God initially gave them. Those Christians who refuse to use their gifts are guilty of quenching the work of the Holy Spirit in their lives.
