Fr David's arrival in our parishes

Fr David will be moving into the Vicarage at Long Eaton at the end of this week and will be having some time to himself to unpack and settle in. There are then certain legal requirements. Normally these would be occasions for us all to gather in celebration but this is not possible with the current Covid-19 restrictions. Fr David's collation and licensing will therefore be carried out on Zoom with restricted number but the Bishop of Derby and Bishop Jonathan will be involved. His induction as the Vicar of St Laurence's has legally to be physically in the church itself and there will be limited numbers attending. This is of course subject to any extension of restrictions imposed by the government. Although it will be a joy for Fr David to be with us we will not be able to demonstrate our normal hospitality but we would hope to be able to do that at some time in the future.

First Reading: *Ezekiel 34: 11-12 15-17*

We end the Church's liturgical year with a vision of the Universal King's return. Ezekiel's prophecy is God's judgment against the failed and hypocritical leaders of Israel who do not rightly "shepherd" the flock of God's people. The symbolic imagery of a Shepherd-King was typical in the literature of the ancient Near East, and is employed throughout the Old and New Testaments. God promised through His prophets that from the ancestral line of the Shepherd-King David, He would send a righteous "Branch," the Messiah, to "shepherd" His people. Ezekiel uses the same "shepherding" theme when God promised that He would come Himself to shepherd His people and this was fulfilled in the person of Jesus the Messiah, the Christ of God, the Universal King.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28

St. Paul teaches that Jesus' reign as King, inaugurated in His Resurrection, will last until His Second Advent when He will return to collect His Bride, the Church, and sit as the Divine Judge. After the Last Judgment, He will take His Bride to Heaven for the Wedding Supper of the Lamb when He submits Himself and His Church to the Father.

Gospel: Matthew 25: 31-46

Jesus identifies Himself with the poor, oppressed, and outcast, He makes the Christian's outpouring of active Love toward those who suffer a condition for entering His eternal Kingdom. We cannot hope for an eternal reward without Loving God, and the Love of God is inextricably linked to Love, concern and service for our brothers and sisters in the family of humanity. We must remember that Jesus Christ's Second Advent does not mark the end but a new beginning for those who Love Him and are obedient to His call to Love. The smallest act of Love is never wasted!
